

Cayman Islands Football Association (CIFA)

Zero Tolerance Policy Towards Violent Conduct



Declaration

All participants in the CIFA activities (club members, players, coaches, managers, volunteers, administrators, members of committee and any other stakeholders), individually, a "Member" and collectively, the "Members," do hereby agree and affirm the commitment to, and support of, CIFA's Zero Tolerance Policy Towards Violent Conduct at CIFA matches and any other CIFA events.

We all members, for and on behalf of the Cayman Islands Football Community, do hereby acknowledge and agree that:

1. Any incidence of a "Member" assaulting, threatening violence to, threatening to destroy or damage the property of, using threatening, abusive or indecent language to, a player, coach, manager, match official or spectator will be immediately referred to the Royal Cayman Islands Police Service and to the CIFA Disciplinary Committee.
2. Any incidence of a "Member" assaulting, threatening violence to, threatening to destroy or damage the property of, using threatening, abusive or indecent language to, a player, coach, manager, match official or spectator will result in the "Member" being referred to the CIFA Disciplinary Committee and the immediate suspension of the "Member" by the CIFA Disciplinary Committee from all football related activities.
3. Any reported incident of a "Member" threatening violence against match officials outside the field of play or in public places will be referred to the CIFA Disciplinary Committee.
4. Any person suspended by the CIFA Disciplinary Committee for recurrent violent conduct will be subject to further disciplinary actions that can lead to further suspensions and may not be allowed to participate in football activities until serving the suspensions. CIFA also can demand immediate payment of fines (including the payment for any yellow card and/or red card fees relating to the incident) which can lead to further sanctions should the payment is not made as demanded by CIFA.
5. If the club fails to pay the relevant fine referred to in point 4 above, the respective team shall not be permitted to play in the competition(s) where the infringement occurred until the fine is paid to CIFA.
6. Royal Cayman Islands Police Service officers will be retained as security for selected CIFA matches.
7. The club should report to CIFA, on official club letterhead, any misconduct by match officials against "Members". Such matters will be referred to the CIFA Disciplinary Committee.
